JOB SCOPE

Clinical assistants are responsible for assisting psychologists to implement treatment plans through in-clinic direct intervention. The clinical assistant may meet with parents to do parent coaching sessions. They will assist patients with developing skills such as executive functioning, social cognition, communication, and self advocacy. The clinical assistant will monitor behavior, record and collect data on patients' progress, and communicate with the client's parent or guardian. Other duties may include clerical and administrative duties.

Primary duties and responsibilities include but are not limited to:

- Provide behavior intervention services to individuals diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder and other developmental disorders in the clinic
- Implement behavior intervention and skill acquisition plans created by and under the supervision of a licensed clinical psychologist
- Collect and record data
- Complete accurate treatment notes in a timely manner
- Strictly follow state board of psychology guidelines for codes of conduct
- Attend team meetings
- Motivate and encourage clients and staff
- Other duties to be assigned as needed
